### A FIRST LOOK AT THE PROGRAM

Welcome to the Kosovo/ North Macedonia Theatre Showcase — a platform for exchange, international promotion, and networking within Kosovo's theatre scene. It brings together international festival programmers, critics, theatre makers, and journalists. For the first time this year, the program features an intercontinental premiere, showcasing artists and themes from both Kosovo and Africa.

This year's program will showcase approximately 10 performances from Kosovo and North Macedonia, while also critically examining the level of cultural exchange between these neighboring countries. The themes are global in scope, addressing a diverse range of subjects.

The social and political landscape in North Macedonia remains complex, marked by limited interaction between its two largest communities—Albanian and Macedonian. This division is also evident in the theatre scene, where public institutions are largely separated along community lines.

While plays by Macedonian authors have been staged in Albanian-language theatres, to our knowledge, Macedonian theatres have never produced a play by an Albanian author. Despite Albanians comprising about thirty percent of North Macedonia's population—and the country's physical closeness to both Albania and Kosovo—Macedonian-language theatres have yet to present works by Albanian playwrights. This reflects not only the limited cultural exchange between Kosovo and North Macedonia but also the broader lack of artistic dialogue within North Macedonia itself, between its diverse communities.

Today, we remain nomads — not just for practical reasons, but more importantly for conceptual and value-based ones. We believe that being physically present in different places and contexts creates a richer space for learning and understanding. This is especially vital in a region like ours, where proximity is close, yet distance and division are perpetually reinforced. In this spirit, last year we moved to Albania, and this year, part of the program will take place in North Macedonia.

This year's edition will showcase performances from both the public and independent theatre scenes of Kosovo and North Macedonia, accompanied by a discursive program that explores pressing social and theatre-related issues—both within these contexts and globally. The event will also feature artist talks, panel discussions, networking sessions, a playwrights' workshop, and a critics' workshop.

The Kosovo / North Macedonia Theatre Showcase begins on October 28, 2025 in Kosovo—across the cities of Prizren, Gjakova, Prishtina, and Ferizaj—while the North Macedonia segment continues in Skopje from October 30 to November 1.

### DO IT OR DIE 29/10/2025 - 19:00

"Do it or Die" is a performance tribute to the esteemed Albanian politician, intellectual, and professor Ukshin Hoti, who was a former political prisoner in Yugoslav and Serbian prisons.

Officially, he remains one of over 1,500 missing persons from the war, whose bodies have yet to be recovered.
